

I had an interest in wood and tools and started taking woodworking classes through Blackhawk Tech around 2003. I have been working on restoring our 1867 Victorian home since 1990 and have used my skills to help me in this adventure. I have built several pieces of furniture for our home and built my kitchen cabinets.

One of my woodworking friends, Chuck Goldstein, told me at the end of 2016 that he thought I would really enjoy woodturning. He set me up with a nice Cherry Burl and my new obsession began. I turned my first bowl and, of course, I wanted a lathe. My husband said I could buy a used one on Craig's List.

After a year, I wanted a more powerful lathe. My husband was very supportive and told me to buy my new lathe.

Last year I received a letter from Women In Turning announcing the sign up period for the 2023 WIT Exchange. I enrolled and was placed on a team of 3 turners from 3 states. I worked with a doctor from Tennessee and Marie Anderson, who is on the Executive Committee of WIT, and lives in Illinois. We all met weekly via Zoom and were give 3 key words to guide our project. I was lucky that Marie only lives a little more than an hour away and was able to come to my house several times so we could work together.

This project was extremely challenging, but so rewarding. I can't wait to sign up for the 2024 Exchange! The projects for the 2023 Exchange are featured in the December, 2023 edition of The American Woodturner.




Cyndi Kraus is offering a beginner's class on **Kitchen Scoops** with assistant Rodney Bethel.
